PBL Context

The Context

From a teacher, after having attended the Regular Course many years ago, you have practiced and found yourself evolving into a skilled facilitator, as consistently & gently encouraged to be one during the short course!

The Context

As a result of your persevering and sustaining effort in nurturing your students for many years, you have managed to make a difference in many of their lives. Some of these students did come back, after some time, to acknowledge you as an extraordinary and caring teacher!

The Context

The director/principal/head master/head mistress of school has come to know of your efforts. He/she has proposed an incentive to reward such teachers like you, and there are quite a few of them in their school, he/she comes to realize.

You received a letter from the MOE. In it, as a reward you found out that they are sending you for an educational tour to places you are interested to visit.

This is a real teacher-centred reward by the MOE, recognizing your reward given to your own students by practising studentçentred learning in the classrooms.

This reward comes with an official leave of up to 10 days to be taken within that year. You are given up to USD4,000.00 for your expenses. You are to submit your plan itinerary to the MOE for approval detailing your expected daily tour itinerary and expenses.
