


# JUDGING OF PROJECT EXHIBITS



## Project Exhibit Setup

#### **Designated Time**



#### Assigned Locations

Each project has a designated table and room allocated for its exhibit. Participants must not change or move their assigned locations, and must leave the provided labels on their tables.

#### Locked Rooms

After 1:00 PM, all rooms for the project exhibits will be locked and will only be opened according to the judging schedule. Participants cannot make any changes to their exhibits after this time.



### **Competition Rules**



### Registration

All presenters participating in the competition must be registered in advance.

### **3 Judging Room Entry**

Presenters whose projects will be judged will be escorted to the judging room by the person in charge **5 minutes earlier**. 2

## Waiting Room

Presenters must be in the designated waiting room (Malaya and Sarawak rooms) 30 minutes before their judging session begins.

## **Judging Room Entry**

Presenters will only be allowed to enter the room as instructed by the person in charge. **No advisors** /teachers are permitted to be waiting outside the judging room.

Only 1- 4 presenters (for each project) are allowed to present their projects accordingly.

### **Judging Room Entry**

No one else is allowed to wait outside the judging room when the judging process is going on except for those presenters who will be judged next.

### Disqualification

**NO** keeping of materials/dismantling of booth by presenters who have completed their judging is allowed when the judging process is ongoing.



# Competition RulesDisqualification



- •Limited to a 20-minute duration, and the next 5 minutes is for the Q&A session, a total of 25 minutes.
- •Presenters must adhere strictly to this time limit to allow for a well-organized congress.
- An alarm signal will be used by the time-keepers;
- ØAt the 20-minute mark, the timekeepers will sound the alarm to let the presenter/judges know that time is up.
- ØThe next 5 minutes are for Q&A session.

### 10 Disqualification

Presenters who do not comply with the SSYS 2024 Competition RULES and do not appear in the judging room as requested before the judging process begins will be automatically **DISQUALIFIED.**

Waiting Room

Presenters must gather in the designated waiting room 30 minutes before their judging session.

Only the registered presenters (1-4 per project) are allowed to enter the judging room and present their projects.

After the judging process, presenters must immediately leave the room, and no dismantling of booths is allowed while judging is ongoing.

You are only allowed to dismantle and clean up your project space after the closing ceremony (After 5.30 pm on the 13<sup>th</sup> of June 2024). Failure to do so will lead to **DISQUALIFICATION** of the team.

Penang Hill is the oldest British hill station in Southeast Asia, dated late 1700's. The highest peak of Penang Hill stand at 833 metres (2,732ft) above sea level. Penang Hill funicular train service started on October 1923 The current funicular trains is the 4th generation system which started its operation on 24th April 2011. The funicular track stretches a distance of 1,996 metres (1.99KM) from lower to Upper Station which is the longest in Asia. Penang Hill funicular tunnel, at 79 metres (258ft) long and 10feet (3.0m) wide with a steepness of 27.9degree, is the steepest tunnel track in the world.



# TECH DOME

#### Entrance Fee

Tech dome - RM40.00 (Include STEM Challenge activities 3 hours + meals )

Tech Dome Penang is a notfor-profit science and technology centre run by Penang Tech Centre. It is an initiative by the Penang State Government and the setup was done in Public Public-Private Partnerships. With an area of approximately 45,000 sq ft,Tech Dome Penang has over 120 interactive science and technology exhibits.



# **STREET ART & CHOWRASTA MARKET -NO ENTRANCE FEE**

#### **STREET ART**

Georgetown belongs to the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites as of 2008. Penang and Georgetown especially is famous for its food, famous street art and beautiful nature. In Penang you can also visit the National Park, UNESCO smallest protected national park. Georgetown has an rich culture and many old buildings, making the city in combination with the street art an living museum. This is why Georgetown attracts much tourism and many. A part of the Street Art, are the iron sculptures. The sculptures tell the story of Georgetown, making it an interesting day trip to visit all the art and sculptures. Since the many tourism

that faces Penang Road, one can find a wide variety of Penang's fresh produce, such as pickled nutmegs, durian cakes, dodol (a sweet Malay confection), heh ko (a special Penangite prawn paste), belachan (Malay chilli paste), balms and tau sar pneah (Penang's famous bean paste biscuits). No visit to Penang Island is complete without getting some of these uniquely Penangite produce and delicacies.







# **GURNEY PLAZA & GURNEY PARK- NO ENTRANCE FEE**

#### **GURNEY PLAZA**

is strategically located in the famous Gurney Drive promenade in Penang and approximately three kilometres to the north-west of the city centre of Georgetown, Penang's capital. It is Penang's premier lifestyle shopping mall and a one-stop shopping and entertainment destination catering to both families and tourists arriving in Penang.





#### **GURNEY PARK**

The much anticipated first phase of Gurney Bay in Penang, built on reclaimed land at the cost of RM221 million, is finally open to the public from today. The first phase of the park featured a viewing deck, a playground, a skate park, kiosks, toilet and open air car parks that covers over 27 acres





# **BOTANICAL GARDEN- NO ENTRANCE FEE**

The Penang Botanic Gardens is a botanical garden within the city of George Town in the Malaysian state of Penang. Situated at Jalan Air Terjun (Waterfall Road), it is also colloquially known as the Waterfall Gardens because of the cascading waterfall nearby.

The original gardens were established in 1884 from an old quarry site, under the supervision of Charles Curtis, who was the first superintendent, making it one of the oldest botanic gardens built by the British in a colonial settlement.

Penang Botanic Gardens is part of Penang Hill Biosphere Reserve, recognized by UNESCO as the third Biosphere Reserve in Malaysia listed in the World Network of Biosphere Reserve.
